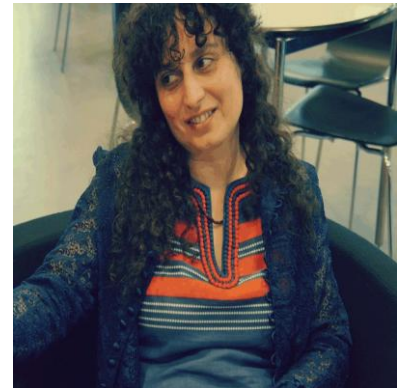


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Dora Kostakopoulou joined Warwick Law School in September 2012 as Professor of European Union Law, European Integration and Public Policy. Formerly, she was Jean Monnet Professor in European Law and European Integration and Co-director of the Institute of Law, Economy and Global Governance at the University of Manchester (2005-2011) and Professor of European Union Law and Director of the Centre for European Law at the University of Southampton (2011-2012). Dora joined the AHRC's Peer Review College in 2009 and is a member of the editorial board of *Citizenship Studies*. She has been British Academy, Thank Offering to Britain Fellow (2003-2004) and recipient of an Innovation Award by the Arts and Humanities Research Council (2004-2005). She is the author of *Citizenship, Identity and Immigration in the European Union: Between Past and Future* (2001, Manchester University Press) and *The Future Governance of Citizenship* which was published by Cambridge University Press in 2008 (Law in Context Series). She has co-edited *A Redefinition of Belonging? Language and Integration Tests in Europe* (2010, Martinus Nijhoff) and *The Reconceptualisation of European Union Citizenship* (Forthcoming, Martinus Nijhoff).

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
