Ioannis Lianos is a Reader in European and Competition Law & Economics at the Faculty of Laws, UCL in London and the Gutenberg Research Chair at the Ecole Nationale d'Administration (ENA) in France. Ioannis is the founder and Director of the Centre for Law, Economics and Society (CLES) at UCL Laws and the associate executive director of the Jevons Institute of Competition Law & Economics at UCL. He is a visiting Professor in competition and intellectual property law at the Universities of Chile in Santiago, the University of Strasbourg and a fellow at the Centre for Law & Economics at the Australian National University. He has previously been an Emile Noel Fellow at the Jean Monnet Centre at New York University School of Law and a fellow at the Boalt Hall School of Law, University of California, Berkeley. His primary research interest lies in European competition law, global competition law & policy, economic evidence and the legal system, law, economics and sociology. Ioannis is a Non-Governmental Advisor (NGA) at the International Competition Network (ICN) since 2009, a research partner to UNCTAD in competition law and policy since 2010, an elected member of the advisory board of the American Antitrust Institute since 2010. He is a member of the advisory board of many Institutes active in the area of competition law and policy globally and a senior editor in many specialized journals in this field as well as the co-editor of the Global Competition Law & Economics series. He has published extensively books and articles in various languages and leading academic journals. In 2012 he was awarded the Philip Leverhulme prize for his seminal research on economic evidence. He is also a Laureat of the French Academy of Moral and Political Sciences (2005).
